
We are discerning when we decide to do the right thing in the interests and needs of others because we know it will have a positive impact on their lives.

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

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## SEND Support

### Special Educational Needs

In case you missed it last week here is another shout out for the workshop sessions offered by Coventry's Complex Communication Team. I know several parents have booked onto the sessions already, they look very useful.

The sessions are over six weeks and are aimed at parents and carers of children and young people on the autism spectrum and with complex communication needs.

The sessions are delivered virtually through Microsoft Teams and are led by a specialist teacher. All sessions are from 4.30pm - 5.45 pm.

The range of topics includes:

Week I — Understanding your child and their Autism

Week 2 — Supporting your child with self-care and independence

Week 3- Supporting your child and their sensory processing differences.

Week 4- Supporting your child and their behaviours

Week 5- Supporting your child with their learning

Week 6- Supporting your child with transitions

The aims of each session will be:

- To raise awareness of how Autism/CCN affect your child
- -To develop a shared understanding of some of the challenges that our children face and the strengths they can bring
- -To increase your confidence in understanding and supporting your child
- -To build up a bank of ideas and strategies that can be used to support your child

There will be weekly advice clinics to accompany each session where you have an allocated slot to ask specific questions relating to your child.

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
