Thank you to all parents who have updated healthcare plans with me. All children with asthma or an allergy must now have a healthcare plan.


If you haven't yet done so please can you return the signed slip to say that the information on the updated plan is correct.



Clubs

Please note: Football kits and branded clothing are not part of our school PE uniform policy, however these can be brought to school to change into, if attending an after school club.

Kits

Children will need to come to school in their PE kit on the days they attend After School Club. For football sessions, they must bring long socks and shin pads due to Health and Safety, children will not be able to join in without shin pads. If children wish to change into a football kit, this will be done independently at the beginning of the dub, but football kits are not to be worn during the school day. Clubs finish at 4:10pm and collection is from the office at the main entrance. If parents are consistently late to collect their children, they may have to be removed from the club, as staff have their own commitments after school.

Grandmother's Footsteps!

Fundraising


