



The contract below was sent out to all parents before clubs became available

After School Club Contract

By signing your child up to an after-school club, you are agreeing that:

My child will:

Be respectful - to all adults and children within the club

Be kind - with words and actions to all adults and children within the club

Be honest - to all adults and children within the club

Be safe - by listening and following the instructions given to you by the coach or other adults

Be all they can be - to ensure the children get the most fun and enjoyment during the sessions!

We have a waiting list for every club we are running. Unfortunately, if these rules are not followed, appropriate action will be taken and your child may be removed from their club.

Children will need to come to school in their PE kit on the days they attend After School Club. For football sessions, they must bring long socks and shin pads - due to Health and Safety, children will not be able to join in without shin pads. If children wish to change into a football kit, this will be done independently at the beginning of the club, but football kits are not to be worn during the school day. Clubs finish at 4:10pm and collection is from the office at the main entrance. If parents are consistently late to collect their children, they may have to be removed from the club, as staff have their own commitments after school.


Fixtures
